

Analysis of Questions 1 – 4, 7, 15 – 19, 31, 32, 35,38, 39
Prepared for Allee King

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1. How many years have you been in business?

- 4 (2%) had been in business less than 1 year
- 37 (25%) have been in business more than 1 and less than 5 years
- 22 (15%) have been in business more than five and up to 10 years
- 38 (25%) have made it up to the 20 year mark
- 49 (33%) have hit or passed the 20 year mark

The average number of years in business for all 150 respondents was 16.21 years.

2. Did you start the business new, buy it from a family member or buy it from outside the family?

- 101 (68%) said they started the business new.
- 37 (25%) said they bought it from someone outside the family.
- 11 (7%) said they bought it from a family member.

3. Do you own or lease your business location?

119 (79%) said they own their locations

31 (21%) said they lease their space

4. If you lease your location, does your landlord live in the county or outside of the county?

26 (77%) said in county

- 7 (21%) said out of county
- 1 (2%)said both
- ** Statistically, 34 responses would be appropriate for this question because only those who answered "lease" in the previous question should have given a response here.

7. How many employees do you have?

- 43 (29%) indicated they are sole proprietors and no full time or part time employees of any type were noted.
- 20 (14%) indicated they are sole proprietors, but do have employees, with several ranging in from 8 11 full and part time staff members. 2 respondents answered only with the phrase "family run" and 3 wrote "partnership."

90 (61%) used numbers in their answers

9 (15%) said "yes" indicating they have employees but did not tell us how many.

Of the 90 who gave us numbers of employees in their business, the 90 together employ, at the most when at maximum capacity, a total of 1,008, including full and part time permanent and seasonal, for an average of 11.2 people per business.

Of 1,008 jobs reported in 90 different businesses.

- 523 (52%) are reported as full time, year-round.
- 213 (21%) are reported as part time, year-round
- 85 (8%) are reported as full time, seasonal
- 153 (15%) are reported as part time, seasonal.

- 4 (3%) said excellent.
- 38 (26%) said good.
- 58 (40%) said fair.
- 40 (28%) said poor.
- 4 (3%) gave qualified answer, three saying Poor-Fair and one saying Fair Good.

33. If new businesses came into the area, where should they locate?

Choices of Rt. 28, Secondary Roads, Hamlets, and Other were given without direction about how many one might choose.

- 86 (64%) gave one answer.
- 32 (25%) gave two answers.
- 14 (10%) gave three answers.
- 1 (1%)gave four answers.
- 89 (66%) said new business should be on Rt. 28
- 29 (22%) said new business should be on Secondary Drs
- 69 (52%) said new business should be in Hamlets
- 11 (8%) said "other". Those who chose other, filled in comments such as "Depends on type of business (4), "All Over" (3), "villages" (1), "wherever feasible" (1), or "location that's appropriate," (1), and 1 person wanted new business on County Rt. 38.

38. With the information you have today, if the Belleayre Resort Project opened here, what impact do you think it would have on your business?

- 59 (40%) said their business would be greatly improved.
- 57 (39%) said their business would be somewhat improved.
- 24 (17%) said their business would not change much.
- None said their business would be harmed
- 4 (3%) said they would find it very harmful to their business.
- 1 person answered by saying property values would go up.
- 39. If the Belleayre Resort became a reality, would you expect your business to be worth more than it is today or worth less than it is today?
- 102 (84%) said their business would be worth more
 - 6 (5%) said their business would be worth less
 - 9 (7%) said their business would be worth about the same
 - 2 (2%) said they weren't sure
 - 3 (2%) specified the value of their businesses to be in the 200,000 range if the project goes through. (All of those had noted in the previous question that this would be a great improvement for them.

During July and August of this year, interns hired by Crossroads Ventures visited businesses in Shandaken and Middletown in an effort to learn more about the baseline of business activity which currently exists in the area. Because time did not permit in-person completion with all businesses, they also mailed surveys with postage paid envelopes for returning same.

A total of 321 surveys were mailed or delivered to businesses known to exist in the towns of Shandaken and Middletown. Of 321 distributed, 153 were returned, for a total of nearly 48% participation.

While we do not claim the surveys are a statistically valid, random sampling of opinion, we believe the number completed is high enough to be a realistic picture of today's business community. Coupled with

business community support of the project as demonstrated by a petition submitted to the Department of Environmental Conservation, and polls done with statistically valid random samples and error margins of +/-5, and

with other anecdotal information gathered in public and/or organizational meetings,

we believe the picture reflected herein is an accurate representation of the state of the business community today.

SURVEY PARTICIPANTS

Of the 153 returns, 17 demanded total anonymity, while 136 or nearly 89% were comfortable revealing who they were. Known respondents were:

In categorizing the known responsdents, it's important to note that one characteristic of this business community is the tendency for a business owner to do more than one thing or provide more than one business under a single umbrella. For example, there are many food stores that have eat-in sandwich booths and gasoline stations out front. The Blue Barn sells antiques but also has significant income from its interior decorating operation. Many hotels are also restaurants, as was the case with Mountain Gate Lodge, while other hotels have independent restaurant operations on premise such as the Phoenicia Hotel. To categorize, we labeled them according to what we thought the primary business is, though that could be subject to error. The Misc. Retail and Genl. Merchandise categories were somewhat difficult to differentiate.

Of the 90 who gave us numbers of employees in their business, the 90 together employ, at the most when at maximum capacity, a total of 1,008, including full and part time permanent and seasonal, for an average of 11.2 people per business.

Of 1,008 jobs reported in 90 different businesses.

523 (52%) are reported as full time, year-round.

213 (21%) are reported as part time, year-round

85 (8%) are reported as full time, seasonal

153 (15%) are reported as part time, seasonal.

** It is instructive to note that of the four largest employers in the towns of Shandaken and Middletown, only one responded to the survey.

Margaretville Memorial Hospital reported 190 full time year round and 35 part time year round employees and those figures are included herein.

Belleayre Mt. Ski Center employs approximately 50 year round, full time and approximately 300 full and part time seasonal but those numbers are not reported.

Margaretville Central School and Phoenicia Elementary School are the other two large employers of note and are not included herein.

The chart below reflects the distribution of total number of jobs reported.

The top line reflects a total number of jobs (full time year-round, part time year-round, full time seasonal, part time seasonal), reported by one or more employers

The bottom line shows how many of the 90 responders answered by saying they had that maximum number of positions.

More than 50% of our respondents are businesses providing employment only for one or two individuals and perhaps a family member or two.

Of those businesses providing numbers of employees, 63% employ five or fewer individuals when operating at top payroll conditions.

Only 19 of 90 businesses (or 21%) employee more than 10 people throughout a given year.

Without the non-profit institutions of a hospital (which has just filed for bankruptcy), a ski center owned by the State of New York, and two schools, there would be very little employment in the region.

Survey of Community Opinion

In the early summer of 2002, Crossroads engaged the services of Marist College to conduct a scientific survey of community opinion in the Towns of Middletown and Shandaken regarding the proposed Belleayre Resort.

As indicated in the following report from Marist, the results showed that, at the moment, a majority – slightly more than half – of the respondents randomly called in the two Towns support the Project.

But when asked their stance in the event that the developers successfully passed through the Environmental Review process, the ratio of support in both Towns rose to the level of almost 4 to 1.

These figures closely resemble the results of similar polls conducted for Crossroads in 2000 and 2001.

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INTRODUCTION

Crossroads Ventures commissioned the Marist College Institute for Public Opinion to conduct a survey of residents in the towns of Middletown and Shandaken, New York in order to measure their awareness and opinions of the Belleayre Golf and Ski Resort Project.

The report is divided into three sections. The first section contains the survey results. The second section is a guide to understanding how the survey was conducted and how to interpret the survey numbers. It details the study methodology, the sampling design, and how the information was collected. The last section contains the question wording and data tables.

Survey Results

The findings in this study are:

- 1. Residents of Middletown and Shandaken are aware of the Belleayre Resort Project.
 - Nine in ten residents have heard of the Belleayre Resort Project.
 - Most residents of both Middletown and Shandaken, including both those that are full-time and part-time residents, have an awareness of the project.
- 2. Residents support the Belleayre Resort Project.
 - Of those residents that are aware of the project, 52% favor the project, 31% oppose it, and 17% are unsure.
 - Residents of Middletown are more supportive of the Belleayre Resort Project than Shandaken residents. 57% of Middletown residents and 44% of Shandaken residents voice support. In Middletown, 22% of residents oppose the project and 21% are unsure. In Shandaken, 44% of residents oppose the project, and 12% are unsure.
 - □ 53% of full-time residents and 49% of part-time residents support the project. 30% of full-time residents oppose it, and 17% are unsure. 35% of part-time residents oppose the project and 16% are unsure.
- 3. Support for the Belleayre Resort Project increases after residents assess the pros and cons of the project.
 - Residents were asked to identify the position that comes closer to their own on a variety of issues about the Belleayre Resort Project. The results of these questions are presented later in this report. After this list of position questions, residents were asked overall whether they favor or oppose the Belleayre Resort Project and how strongly they feel about their position.
 - Overall, 59% of residents support the Belleayre Resort Project: 18% of residents strongly favor and 41% favor the project. 34% of residents oppose the project: 18% oppose and 16% strongly oppose it. 7% are unsure.

- 69% of Middletown residents strongly favor or favor the Belleayre Resort Project. 23% of Middletown residents oppose or strongly oppose the project, and 8% are unsure.
- □ 48% of Shandaken residents strongly favor or favor the project. 45% of Shandaken residents oppose or strongly oppose the project: 7% are unsure.
- 61% of full-time residents and 57% of part-time residents favor or strongly favor the project.
- 4. Residents who oppose the Belleayre Resort Project are mostly concerned about traffic and congestion and what affect it will have on the environment.
 - a 31% of residents who have heard of the Belleayre Resort Project are not in favor of it. Among these residents, 24% are concerned about traffic and congestion on Route 28, 24% worry about the effect it will have on the environment, 9% are concerned about the size and scope of the project, and 8% worry it will change the natural beauty of the area.
- 5. Most residents support the Belleayre Resort Project if it brings quality jobs to their local communities.¹
 - 78% of residents do support the Belleayre Resort Project if it brings quality jobs at good salaries to their towns.
 - Jobs are especially important for residents of Middletown where 86% of residents favor the project if it brings jobs to their community. 67% of Shandaken residents share this view.
 - a 80% of full-time residents and 74% of part-time residents favor the Belleayre Resort Project if it brings quality jobs to the area.
- 6. Most residents support the Belleayre Resort Project if their concerns about the environment are solved through the environmental review process.
 - 70% of residents are in favor of the Belleayre Resort Project if their concerns are resolved through the environmental review process. 77% of Middletown residents and 61% of Shandaken residents share this view.

¹ Results for support on these questions include residents who favor the project and residents who initially said they opposed it but then would favor the project if the condition in the follow-up question was met: jobs, environmental review, and tax benefits.

73% of full-time residents and 64% of part-time residents support the Belleayre Resort Project if environmental concerns are resolved through the review process.

7. Most residents support the Belleayre Resort Project if it reduces or holds down local taxes.

- a 69% of residents support the Belleayre project if it reduces or holds down taxes in their communities.
- 76% of Middletown and 61% of Shandaken residents share this view. 73% of full-time and 63% of part-time residents favor the Belleayre Resort Project if it reduces or holds down local taxes.
- 8. The Belleayre Resort Project is seen as a benefit to the local economy.
 - a 63% of residents feel their local economy is struggling and the Belleayre Resort Project would be a benefit to the economic health of their communities. 29% of residents believe their local economy is already moving in the right direction and the Belleayre Resort Project is not a benefit to their area. 8% of residents are unsure.
 - 72% of Middletown residents think the project will help their local economy, whereas 52% of Shandaken residents hold this view.
 - Both full-time and part-time residents think the project will help the economy in their communities, 63% and 62%, respectively.
- 9. Residents believe the Belleayre Resort Project will bring year round jobs to the area and not just seasonal employment.
 - 59% of residents believe the Belleayre Resort Project will provide year round jobs for residents in the area.
 - 65% of Middletown residents and 52% of Shandaken residents feel the jobs created by the Belleayre Resort Project will be year round.
 - 64% of full-time residents and 50% of part-time residents share this view.
- 10. Residents see the Belleayre Resort Project as bringing year round tourism to the area rather than mostly increasing traffic.
 - 53% of residents think the Belleayre Resort Project will bring year round tourism to the area. 39% of residents think it will increase traffic. 8% of residents are unsure.

- 61% of Middletown residents believe the Belleayre Resort Project will create year round tourism. However, in Shandaken, 42% of residents believe the Belleayre Resort Project will increase tourism, but 49% believe it will increase traffic.
- A majority of full-time residents, 56%, believe the Belleayre Resort Project will create year round tourism and 46% of part-time residents share this view.
- 11. Residents believe the Belleayre Resort Project will increase the local tax base and not mean higher taxes for residents.
 - Nearly half of residents, 49%, feel the Belleayre Resort Project will increase the tax base for their towns through more business activity. 34% feel it will increase taxes for town residents due to a need for more services. 17% of residents are unsure.
 - □ 53% of Middletown residents and 45% of Shandaken residents believe the Belleayre Resort Project will increase the tax base for their towns.
 - □ 50% of full-time residents and 48% of part-time residents hold this view, although 22% of part-time residents are unsure on the question of local taxes.
- 12. More residents believe the Belleayre Resort Project will preserve open space rather than think it will put at risk water and soil in the developed area.
 - □ 48% of residents believe the Belleayre Resort Project will preserve open space. 41% of residents believe it will affect water quality and soil erosion in the developed area. 11% of residents are unsure.
 - □ 56% of Middletown residents believe the project will preserve open space. In contrast, a majority of Shandaken residents, 51%, feel the project will put water and soil at risk.
 - □ 51% of full-time residents feel it will preserve open space. Part-time residents are more divided. 44% of part-time residents feel it will preserve open space, and 49% of part-time residents feel it will put water and soil at risk.
- 13. More residents think the Belleayre Resort Project will change the existing landscape than think it will increase public access and use of state parks.
 - 48% of residents think the Belleayre Resort Project will change the existing landscape. 41% of residents believe it will increase public access to state parks and 11% are unsure.

- Middletown residents divide on this issue. 46% of residents from Middletown feel public access and use of state parks will increase and 41% feel the landscape will be changed. In contrast, a majority of Shandaken residents, 56%, believe the Belleayre Resort Project will change the existing landscape.
- □ Full-time residents are also divided. 46% of full-time residents feel public access and use of state parks will increase and 46% of full-time residents believe the landscape will be changed. 33% of part-time residents point to an increase in public access to the state parks and 49% of part-time residents feel there will be a change in the landscape.

14. Most residents think more economic development is needed.

- Most residents feel their communities need more economic development.
 82% strongly agree or agree that there needs to be more economic development in the area.
- □ This sentiment is especially strong in Middletown where nine in ten residents feel this way. 72% of Shandaken residents share this view.
- 82% of full-time residents and 81% of part-time residents strongly agree or agree more economic development is needed in their communities.

15. Residents believe tourism should be increased to support the local economy.

- Over three-quarters of residents, 77%, think tourism should be increased to help support their local economy. 20% of residents disagree or strongly disagree that tourism should be increased. 3% of residents are unsure.
- 82% of Middletown residents and 71% of Shandaken residents strongly agree or agree that tourism should be increased to support their local economies.
- □ 75% of full-time residents and 80% of part-time residents share this view.

16. Residents believe a world-class resort would improve the image of the Catskill region.

- Nearly two-thirds of residents, 65%, believe a resort would improve the image of the Catskills. 33% disagree or strongly disagree that a resort would improve the image of the area. 2% of residents are unsure.
- □ 73% of Middletown residents and 55% of Shandaken residents feel a resort would improve the image of the Catskills.

- □ Both full-time and part-time residents feel a resort would improve the image of the area, 66% and 63%, respectively.
- 17. Residents think golf is a way for their communities to provide year round tourism.
 - □ 56% of residents think golf is an excellent way for their communities to provide year round tourism. 42% of residents disagree or strongly disagree and 2% are unsure.
 - 66% of Middletown residents support the idea of using golf as a way to promote year round tourism in the area. In contrast, 52% of Shandaken residents disagree or strongly disagree that golf is an excellent way to increase tourism during the non-ski months of the year.
 - 59% of full-time residents and 52% of part-time residents feel golf would be an excellent way to provide year round tourism.
- 18. Residents support a variety of economic development ideas in their communities and think the Belleayre Resort Project will help these efforts.
 - 17% of residents would like to see their communities promote tourism through the support and encouragement of small hotels, motels, and bed and breakfasts. 11% of residents favor any development that would bring jobs into their communities, and 10% of residents think the best way to encourage economic development is through efforts like the Belleayre Resort Project.
 - © 60% of residents feel the Belleayre Resort Project will help the types of economic development they would like to see in their communities. 30% of residents think the Belleayre Resort Project will hinder the kind of growth they would like to see in their community. 10% of residents are unsure about how the Belleayre Resort Project will affect future development.

How the Survey Was Conducted

Background

Crossroads Ventures commissioned the Marist College Institute for Public Opinion to measure residents' awareness and opinions of the Belleayre Golf and Ski Resort Project. The survey assessed the interests and concerns of residents in the towns of Middletown and Shandaken, New York.

A total of 404 residents, including both full-time year round and part-time seasonal residents in the towns of Middletown and Shandaken were interviewed regarding their opinions and attitudes on these issues. A representative sample was drawn from throughout the towns in proportion to the population within the towns.

How to Interpret the Numbers

The goal of a scientifically designed survey sample is to be representative of the population that is being surveyed. The results obtained from a scientific probability survey are not just answers from those individuals who responded but more importantly, because of the design and methods by which the data is collected, can be used to generalize to the population as a whole. For this survey, the results are an estimate of what would have been obtained, within a certain range, if all households throughout the towns of Middletown and Shandaken were interviewed. In reviewing the information detailed in this report, totals may not add to 100% due to rounding.

When analyzing the survey results, it should be kept in mind that in all surveys each result is an estimate of what would have been obtained had everyone in the eligible population been interviewed, in this instance, all households within the towns of Middletown and Shandaken. This difference between the responses if all households within the towns had been interviewed and the survey results is referred to as sampling error and is primarily based upon the number of interviews in the survey sample.

The sampling error for the survey results is $\pm 4.7\%$. The sampling error diminishes slightly for questions whose results are at the extremes and the sampling error increases as the number of interviews for a particular group or sub-group within the sample declines.

Methodology

Sample Design

A stratified random digit dial (RDD) probability design was used to draw the telephone numbers for both surveys. RDD ensures representation of both listed and unlisted telephone numbers. Households were selected at random in proportion to the full and part time populations in the towns of Shandaken and Middletown. Survey Sampling Inc. in Fairfield, Connecticut, provided telephone numbers according to the above-described design.

Data Collection

The questionnaire and the telephone samples were programmed for computer assisted telephone interviewing (CATI). Interviewing was conducted from a centralized telephone facility using trained interviewers who were specifically briefed on this study. Interviews were conducted June 27th, 28th, 29th, 30th, July 9th and 10th, 2002. Polling supervisors regularly monitored, evaluated, and provided feedback to the interviewing staff.

Up to 21 attempts to contact a household were made before a telephone number was eliminated from the sample. Callbacks were staggered over times of day and days of the week to maximize the chances of making contact with a potential respondent. Suspended interviews and refusals were re-contacted at least once in order to attempt to convert them to a completed interview. This included callbacks to initial unsuccessful contacts, refusal conversion, and scheduled appointments.

Information collected from survey participants is both confidential and anonymous. Personal identifying information is removed from files after the integrity of the data has been verified.

A prepaid response card was bound into the mailer. Over the next several weeks, no fewer than 5% of the recipients filled out and returned the response cards.

The breakdown of positive and negative responses was remarkably consistent with the Marist poll and earlier opinion poll figures:

495 or (73.66%) were in favor;

131 or (19.4%) were against;

17 responses (2.6%) were ambiguous or had no opinion;

As a business owner in the Town of Middletown, I wish to express my full support for the Belleayre Resort at Catskill Park. I believe this project is just what the area needs. We need this project in order to increase the tax base and enable businesses to stay in business, and pay their property taxes. (Only this past year, school taxes increased by 19 %.).

This development, once approved by the DEC, will expand our tax base, as well as add sales tax receipts to the Counties and the State. In addition, it will provide much-needed jobs for residents of the area.

The Belleayre Ski Center was developed in 1949 by New York State in order to provide an economic stimulus for the area. The rationale for spending taxpayers dollars on such a project was that this would serve to attract private developers to the area. Now this is about to happen; with the Belleayre Resort project that goal is being reached.

Seventy-five percent (75 %) of the land in this area is "Forever Wild", that is, owned by New York State. New York City owns another five to ten percent for their watershed. Therefore a greater majority of the land here is outside the boundary of development.
